Amazing orange groves, Cypriot avenues and blooming oleanders create an atmosphere of tranquility that cannot be found anywhere else. At the same time, the orange garden ends with a terrace with beautiful views of the Tiber, Trastrvere, Janiculum and the Vatican.

Our first stop is the world famous Colosseum. Today you will find information about this building that few people know. Visiting Rome without visiting the Colosseum is a huge mistake. This magnificent monument was built by Emperor Vespasian in 72-80 BC, and then by Titus Flavius. Colosseum (lat. Colossus-giant). There is an animal cage and a storage room in the basement of the building. The emperor's throne was located next to the stage (height 3.5m). From the top, the relatives of the emperor sat on the 1st floor, the upper class people on the 2nd floor, and the common people on the last 3rd and 4th floors. The seats are made of stone, the construction of the building is reinforced with concrete and brick. Another fact is that all the gladiator fights before BC were held only in this building, but by the year 405, the gladiator fight as we know it ended with the decree of Emperor Honorius. The Colosseum was built on a plain, as a separate structure. At that time, the building was 189 meters long and 156 meters wide. The area is 24,000 square meters. Another fact about the Colosseum: the seats of the Colosseum were arranged by sectors and numbers, just like today. The official opening of the Colosseum, which witnessed terrible events during its construction, lasted for about 100 days. From

the beginning of the 19th century, the Colosseum was used by priests to conduct religious ceremonies. The Colosseum is one of the most visited buildings in Rome. An example of this could be 500,000 or more visitors per year. This is information from 27.12.2020. The city of Rome is located on the west coast of Italy, 24,000 meters from the confluence of the Tiber River into the Tyrrhenian Sea. Rome is located on a hill known as Rome Campagna. The most interesting facts about Rome are: The city is bordered by low mountains: Sabina and Prenestani in the east, Albani in the south-east, and Sabatini mountains in the north-west.

Vatican City, official name is Vatican City-State (Latin Status Civitatis Vaticanae). This country is a free country located on the hill of Monte Vatican in the western part of the city of Rome. Almost all sides are surrounded by stone fences. Its area is only 44 hectares. The population is 454 (2019) people. The official language is Latin and Italian. The Vatican City is an unlimited theocratic monarchy city-state. The official constitutional document was adopted in February 1929. The ruler of the state is the Pope. The head of state, Pope John Paul II (the 264th pope) was elected on October 16, 1978. This day is celebrated as a national holiday in the Vatican. In the early Middle Ages, the Vatican was the residence of the Popes, and since 1377 it has been a permanent residence, and the church has existed as a state since the 8th century. The Vatican administrative complex, which first began to grow in the Middle Ages, includes the Vatican Palace complex (55 sq.m.), which includes many buildings created in the 15th and 16th centuries. In its time, the ensemble was decorated with paintings by the muralists B. Michelangelo, P. Perugino, S. Botticelli, and D. Ghirlandario. St. Peter's Cathedral (architects D. Bramante, Michelangelo, etc.), a row of columns on Navona square (architect L. Bernini) were added to the Vatican complex.
